Concept Note

Main Focus

Here the term 'GIRL' denoted any unmarried female from the time of her birth to adulthood, i.e. upto the age of 18. Basically a girl child is one who belongs to any age from the period of its birth to 14 years and girl in the age-group of 14-18 years would be considered as young / adolescent.

Conference Methodology
